## BAD FOR TEACHER RETENTION



Programs that promote under-certified teachers

**CONTRACTUALLY  
OBLIGATE**

school districts to protect positions for under-certified teachers, displacing traditionally certified teachers<sup>1</sup>

## BAD FOR TEACHER DIVERSITY



Under-certified teachers
