Please briefly describe what experiences an intern in your district would receive: The Dysart intern experience is well rounded! Interns get experience from preschool to high school with a broad range of disabilities. Experiences can include: MTSS team support, conducting initial and re-evaluations, participation on early childhood district screening teams, completing and implementing FBA's and BIP's in conjunction with district behavior team members, teacher and parent consultation, participation in department school psychologist and mentor meetings, participation on threat assessment teams, crisis intervention training and support, implementing social skill groups, and providing curriculum support for a variety of disabilities and specialized programs.

Interns are placed with an experienced Dysart School Psychologist, so supervision is built in almost daily, if not 2-3 times a week. Once the intern is more independent and in the 2nd semester of the school year, they are expected to run the school's caseload with continued supervisor support.

Additionally, interns are on the same 211 day calendar as all district school psychologists. (Typically starting mid July through the end of May or very beginning of June).
