What are intern assignments from day 1? at own school 2-3 days and side-by-side with supervisor other days

Please briefly describe what experiences an intern in your district would receive: The current FUSD internship model involves assignment to one elementary school for 2 days per week for the entire school year. The expectation is that the intern will work with increasing independence at the school and require decreasing onsite supervision. While remaining at the primary assignment throughout the year, the intern will rotate through other assignments on roughly 12 week intervals. The intern will, therefore, gain experience in a high school, middle school, and preschool and with a variety of issues and disability types. There will be side-by-side supervision in each of the rotations by the psychologist assigned to that setting, along with continued weekly supervision by the primary internship supervisor.

What other information should intern candidates know about your district or internship experience that is not listed here?

The FUSD intern has a primary supervisor ultimately responsible for programming. The intern, though, receives additional supervision at each of the rotation sites. Our aim is to provide a multitude of experiences while building your skills of independence at a primary site. FUSD psychologists are primarily involved in assessment tasks. There is some involvement in MTSS activities, such as progress monitoring, data analysis, and technical assistance on academic interventions. Consultation on behavioral issues, writing FBAs and BIPS, assessing for risk of threat or self-harm, responding to crisis situations, and conducting manifestation meetings are all common activities. Opportunities for direct counseling with students is limited.

Internship candidates must apply for the position through the district website. Compensation is 1/2 the salary of a starting school psychologist, which roughly equates to \$33,500. The position does not include benefits.
