Please briefly describe what experiences an intern in your district would receive: FUSD interns are able to have a vast experience with students pre-k to 12th grade, as well as private/public day. Our schools are K-8, 9-12 but regardless of intern placement, you're able to work with a variety of students who may not be at your campus for the experience. Our interns generally have their own site, but are supported by the lead psychologist. We use a PSW model for SLD identification not discrepancy.

What other information should intern candidates know about your district or internship experience that is not listed here? We are a growing district with most of our schools located in San Tan Valley. We have 13 school psychologists, and our ratio of students to psychologists is closely aligned with the NASP recommendation. We've also added 6 social worker positions to the district this year. Eleven of our 12 schools are fully implementing PBIS and we have been focusing on overall improvements in the use of MTSS. Schools all have SEL Teams, we conduct SEL screenings and intervention within MTSS including Tier I essential practices. Our special education director is also a school psychologist and our assistant superintendent highly values and respects the work that we do, both are extremely supportive to our team of psychologists. We have a great group of psychologists and everyone helps each other out.
