Important Information Regarding the 2024-2025 FAFSA

- The 2024-2025 FAFSA is coming with some significant changes. The most noteworthy change that will impact students is that the 2024-2025 FAFSA will not open on October 1 as is normal. The U.S. Department of Education has informed schools that the FAFSA will be available some time in December 2023, but has not set an official release date at this time.

How to Apply for Financial Aid

- **A Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be filed each year** for Federal Loans or for College of Education scholarships consideration. Links: [FAFSA](#) | [FSA ID](#)
- Remember to add the University of Arizona to your FAFSA in the school selection section! Our federal school code is **001083**.
- File the **2023-2024** FAFSA to apply for financial aid for the **Summer 2024 semester**. Use your **2021** income tax information.
- File the **2024-2025** FAFSA to apply for financial aid for the **Fall 2024/Spring 2025 semesters**. Use your **2022** income tax information.
- **Don't experience an unnecessary delay in getting your aid offer!** These FAFSA questions are the most common to be answered incorrectly:
 - **Question #26: What will your college grade level be when you begin the 2023-2024 school year?**
What your answer should be: 1st year (or continuing) Graduate/Professional
 - **Question #27: What college degree or certificate will you be working on when you begin the 2023-2024 school year?**
What your answer should be: Graduate or Professional Degree
 - **Question #44: At the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year, will you be working on a master's or doctorate program?**
What your answer should be: Yes

NOTE: Even if you were an Undergraduate student at the beginning of the school year, you will need to correct the 2023-2024 FAFSA per the information above. We recommend waiting to do this until you have been officially admitted to your Graduate program.

- **Non-Degree Seeking Graduate Students** are not eligible for Federal Direct Loans (Graduate Unsubsidized and PLUS, discussed in next section) **unless** they are able to document that they are taking a minimum of **6 units** of preparatory coursework which is necessary to be admitted to and enroll in an eligible Graduate/Professional degree program. If the above applies, the student must submit the [Graduate Non-Degree Seeking Petition for Federal Financial Aid](#) form to the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid. Please review the policy and download the form at <https://financialaid.arizona.edu/policies/non-degree-seeking-graduates>. If your petition is approved, you may be offered federal subsidized and/or unsubsidized loans commensurate with the limits of an undergraduate senior grade level student based on your FAFSA dependency status (up to \$12,500 for independent students, up to \$7,500 for dependent students).

Important Reminders

- Your social security number must be on file in UAccess (be sure to include it on your application for admission) for your FAFSA to be received by OSFA.
- Monitor personal, financial, and academic information often on UAccess Student at <http://uaccess.arizona.edu/>. To follow the progress of your financial aid, check *To Do List*, *Notices & Holds*, and *My Financial Aid Status* pages in UAccess.

Types of Financial Aid Available through the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid (OSFA)

- **Scholarships and Grants:** Register with [Scholarship Universe](#) for scholarship opportunities. If you previously established your Scholarship Universe profile as an undergraduate, you should log in and navigate to the 'Questions' section to update your intended enrollment and academic level.
- **Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loans:** Graduate degree students may borrow up to \$20,500 per academic year. Visit <https://studentaid.gov/understand-aid/types/loans/interest-rates> for details about interest rates and fees.
- **Graduate PLUS Loans:**
This is another type of unsubsidized loan available to supplement Direct loans and scholarships. Visit <https://studentaid.gov/understand-aid/types/loans/plus/grad> for details about interest rates and fees. Approval is subject to a credit check by the U.S. Department of Education (ED). The Federal Graduate PLUS Loan will only be denied for adverse credit reasons. This resource at <https://studentaid.gov/sites/default/files/plus-adverse-credit.pdf> discusses ways that you may still be able to qualify for a Direct PLUS Loan if denied due to adverse credit history.
- **Private Educational Loans** are also available. Visit <https://financialaid.arizona.edu/types-of-aid/loans/private> for additional information about private education loans.
- **TEACH Grant: (Fall/Spring Only)** TEACH Grant is awarded to students who are completing, or intend to complete, coursework to begin a career in teaching and who agree to serve for a minimum of four years as a full-time, highly qualified, high-need field teacher in a low-income school. When will I hear back about my aid offer?

Summer Aid:

Direct Loans and Graduate PLUS loans are available for students enrolled in at least 5 units for the summer sessions. Students may be eligible for Unsubsidized loan which was unused during the fall/spring terms, up to the annual limit (Graduate: \$20,500). If you are enrolled in at least 1 summer unit and have a 2023-2024 FAFSA on file, you will automatically be reviewed for summer aid eligibility. OSFA will begin to evaluate students for Summer 2024 aid beginning **the first week of May**. Award offer notifications are sent to students via UA email (netid@arizona.edu).

Fall/Spring Aid:

Direct Loans and Graduate PLUS loans are available for students enrolled in at least 5 units for Fall and Spring terms. Students may see awards available for the 2024-2025 academic year beginning **in July**. Award offer notifications are sent to students via UA email (netid@arizona.edu).

College of Education & Graduate College Scholarships

Quick Reference Sheet

Graduate College Scholarships

The UA Graduate College offers scholarship opportunities to graduate students. Please go to this website for more information: <https://grad.arizona.edu/funding/opportunities>. Please note that Teach Arizona students are not eligible to apply for the Graduate Access Fellowship and Tuition Awards.

Questions regarding Graduate College scholarships should be directed to the Graduate College.

College of Education Scholarships

- **Arizona Teachers Academy:** Teach Arizona students are eligible to apply for the Arizona Teachers Academy tuition scholarship which pays full tuition and mandatory fees in exchange for an agreement to teach for **ONE** year in an Arizona public school following graduation. You may apply to the Academy prior to being accepted into Teach Arizona, but your Academy application will not be reviewed until you are accepted into Teach Arizona. They are separate applications.  - **NOTE:** If you are part of the Academy, your full tuition is paid. You cannot receive scholarships in addition to the full Academy funding so there is no benefit to applying for a scholarship through Scholarship Universe or the College of Education.
- **College of Education Scholarships:** All Teach Arizona students are eligible for College of Education Scholarships, which are made possible through the generous support of private donors. If you wish to be considered for this assistance, you must file both a 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 FAFSA (international students are exempt from this requirement). No other application is needed. If scholarship funds are limited, we will consider economic need first when awarding this assistance. We will contact you in late spring 2024 to let you know if you have been selected for a College of Education Scholarship and the amount of your award.
- **Teaching Fellows:** (This is only for students in the **Teach Arizona - Tucson** program) If you are interested in student teaching and seeking a teaching position in the Sahuarita, Flowing Wells, Santa Cruz Valley, Marana, Amphitheater or Tucson Unified School Districts upon completion of Teach Arizona, you should consider the Teaching Fellows
