TD3 Interns will receive a broad experience centered on developing interns to be competent, ethically responsible, and independent school psychologists.

Training activities are aimed at developing a broad understanding of psychology practice within school systems. Typical activities include academic and behavioral consultation, counseling, professional development, and multidisciplinary evaluations. Interns are provided opportunities to

develop skills working with students from culturally, linguistically, and economically diverse families in a variety of ways. Primary and secondary rotations allow interns to experience school psychology practice in preschool, elementary, and middle school settings. The training faculty includes school psychologists with diverse areas of expertise. They provide a developmental perspective on training in which the intern begins with observational and hands-on learning with a primary supervisor and progresses to more independent work on more complex tasks. Initially, interns begin by observing various programs and tasks such as evaluations, team meetings, and parent consultation and by attending didactic seminars. As training progresses, interns work more collaboratively with a supervisor with direct supervision and observation. Finally, as interns progress in their level of competence, they become more independent in their practice with more indirect supervision. Interns also have access to secondary rotations and secondary supervisors to ensure that a wide range of experiences across settings are available. Individual and small group supervision is provided.

The Tempe Elementary School District is located in the heart of the “Valley of the Sun.” It encompasses an area of approximately 36 square miles including not only Tempe but also parts of Phoenix and the Town of Guadalupe. Arizona State University, is within the district’s boundaries providing professional and educational opportunities.

Tempe Elementary School District consist of 14 elementary schools (K-5), a developmental preschool, 3 comprehensive middle schools (6-8), a K-8 school,

a K-8 traditional academy, an IB School (6-8), and a Montessori elementary school. The student population of Tempe Elementary School District No. 3 consists of diverse cultural, ethnic, and socio-economic groups. There are approximately 11,000 students in the district.
